Condensed Minutes of Annual Meeting US JI Senate

Meeting called to order by President Bill Miller. There were 35 Senators from 18 states in attendance on 6/23/75.

Secretary Wayland Quisenberry and Treasurer Leo Briere gave their reports. The Treasurer's unaudited report showed expenses for 1974-75 of \$ 2,937.00 and income of \$ 2,584.25 resulting in a loss of \$ 352.75.

Vice Presidents reports were given by: Jim Tobias (Dixie); Bernie Landry (Mid-Atlantic); Norm Baptista (New England); Ken Brookbank (North Central); Ted Landgraf (Mid-America); and Bill Johnson (North Western). Their reports told of adding the following states during the 1974-75 year: Georgia (Dixie); South Dakota (North Central); North Carolina& West Virginia (Mid-Atlantic); and New Hampshire & Maine (New England).

Various reports were given by officers and chairmen:

1. World Senate Directory (Senator Leo Briere) Cost based on 20,000 copies to be approximately \$ 1.00 each.

2. U. S. Senate Directory (Senator Leo Briere) Cost was considered too great to take on as a regular U. S. Senate project. Continuing investigation by the new Executive Committee was suggested.

3. Senate Medallion - Reported by President Bill Miller that the new Medallions were available at JCI Headquarters. But quality was not acceptable, and a vote was taken to reject. A new good and acceptable quality medallion should be available on or around September 1st. Price \$ 25.

4. THE MENTORS - Mike Little, Editor - The report given told of the number of issues mailed, noting cost reflections.

5. SENATE SAMPLER (Senator Mel Routt) 5 issues were furnished this year at a cost of approximately \$ 150.

6. Insurance (Senator Jim O'Connell) CNA mailed 30,000 brochures in 3 different mailings. 202 policies are now in force at \$ 2,100 and \$ 3,000 in premiums. Mailings sent to 1,100 new Senators in 1974-75. \$ 8,000 invested in project.

OLD BUSINESS:

Coming out with a sickness and actident program this fall. Members under 70 can apply and it is renewable. 125 must sign up to enforce. Under 40 the cost is \$ 7.20 semi-annually. Continental will prepare all promotional material at no cost to us.

Meeting recessed at 3:50.

Election meeting of 6/24/75 opened by President Bill Miller. 91 Senators attended. They represented 29 states and 3 foreign countries. A number of wives also were in attendance.

A motion to amend the dues structure effective 7/1/76 was approved after much discussion. It was tabled, reworked and then approved during the meeting. The final format is as follows:

1 - 50 members \$ 1.75 per member \$ 1.50 per member 51 - 150 members \$ 1.25 per member 151 - 400 members \$ 1.00 per member 401 and up
