Speech presented to the U.S. Jaycees Board of Directors
in Tulsa, Oklahoma, January 18, 1990

Last July, Robby Dawkins, Bill Brimmer, Newton Standridge and myself met at Jaycee Headquarters here in Tulsa to discuss various items, one of which was the issue of JCI Senatorships. An agreement was reached that the U.S. JCI Senate organization would attempt to recommend additional requirements to qualify individuals for Senatorships above what is required by JCI. JCI by-law 21-5, section 2, states, "The organization encourages each NOM to establish additional regulations and requirements designed to upgrade the awarding of Senatorships with due regard to local conditions." Many nations have already set additional requirements.

The U.S. JCI Senate established a committee that met at our Sept. 1989, Board of Directors meeting in Atlanta, Georgia. After much discussion from that committee and from various state Senate groups throughout the United States, it is very apparent that there are many differences of opinions on what should be required for a Senatorship. It seems that many SOM's look at this honor in different ways. The U.S. JCI Senate has been deliberately structured so that we realize that many states are different and that we can not force an issue upon them that would be against their principles or policies. We do recognize state rights. By the very nature of these differences, the U.S. JCI Senate organization respectfully submit to the U.S. Jaycees that Senatorship standards should be left up to the individual states and that those states submit their programs to the U.S. Jaycees for approval.

I have had discussions with JCI on this subject and I have received an opinion that state requirements are permissible. W. Daniel Lamey, Secretary-General of JCI, recently confirmed this opinion to me. Past JCI Senate Chairman who is also past President of JCI, Jennifer C.W. Yu, also stated that individual states may set their standards. The important issue is that the State Jaycee President shall have the final approval for their state prior to the application being sent on to the U.S. Jay A Senatorship is a Jaycee honor and therefore we submit that the requirements for this honor should be set "with due regard to local conditions" by each state. The U.S. JCI Senate encourages the awarding of Senatorships throughout the United States and we would like to see additional requirements added so that the honor will be upgraded. The majority of Senatorship standards throughout the world require at least five years of participation in Jaycees before an individual is even considered. It is my opinion that most members of our organization endorse the five year requirement.

In closing, the U.S. JCI Senate appreciates the offer to help in this area, but after much thought and consideration, we feel that since this is a Jaycee honor, the requirements and standards should be set and regulated by Jaycees. If individual states would like to have ad hoc committee's, which may include JCI Senators, I am sure that the Senators would be proud to serve. Ad hoc committees that are formed to assist the State Jaycee President, are also permissible according to JCI. It must be remembered though, that these committee's are there to assist the State Jaycee President and they do not have the power to reject or approve Senatorships. It must be remembered that only the State Jaycee President is to have that power.

Thank you all for your time and for the opportunity to address the members of the Board of Directors of the U.S. Jaycees. I hope you all have a great year.

An award known as "Junior Chamber International (JCI) Senatorship" granting life membership in the organization and in the Junior Chamber International Senate, may be awarded to individual members or past members as a means of honoring them for rendering outstanding service to Junior Chamber. The awarding of such status shall not exempt the member from paying regular dues to the organization.

BY-LAW 21-2. APPLICATION

The application shall only be approved by the president of the LOH of the applicant and the president of his/her local JCI. The application's JCI is so structured that he/she shall be required or permitted. Prior to, or at the same time as, approval by the President of the organization is requested, a contribution of two hundred (U.S. \$200) shall be made to the organization by the sponsoring LOH or MOH. Notes (in the U.S. and additional check must also be made out to the U.S.-Japan for \$25.00. This is a processing fee.)

BY-LAW 21-3. REVOCATION:

B. Senatorship may be revoked, temporarily suspended or withdrawn at any time if at either of the following:

- A. The President of the organization, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee, on the recommendation of the MOH President, if in the opinion of the President of the organization, that Senator has not conducted himself in a manner worthy of the organization.
- B. The Executive Committee, on the recommendation of the President of the organization, if the actions of the Senator are not in the best interests of the organization.

In the event of the revocation, temporary suspension or withdrawal of a Senatorship, no part of the contribution made under the provisions of By-Law 21-2 shall be refunded.

BY-LAW 21-4. RIGHTS:

A Senator, as such, is not qualified to be elected an officer of the organization and shall have no specific rights, except those which are granted to ordinary members of Junior Chamber age, provided the Senator is within Junior Chamber age. Senators who have passed Junior Chamber age shall have no rights whatsoever, except those which may be granted from time to time by the organization.

BY-LAW 21-5. SENATE QUALIFICATIONS:

Section 1. CURRENT MEMBERS: Senatorships for current Individual Members shall be restricted to members of at least three (3) years standing for services rendered at any level of this organization.

Section 2. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: The organization encourages each LOH and MOH to establish additional regulations and requirements designed to upgrade the awarding of Senatorships with due regard to local conditions.

Section 3. PAST MEMBERS: Senatorships for past members whose membership extended for a period of at least three (3) years may be awarded by way of presentation, subject to the written approval of the LOH and MOH presidents who are expected to make such inquiries with respect to the applicants as may, in their opinion, be appropriate.

BY-LAW 21-6. JUNIOR CHAMBER INTERNATIONAL SENATE:

SECTION 1. OBJECTIVES:

- A. To provide a vehicle for the promotion of fellowship and friendship among Senators, internationally, nationally and locally.
- B. To encourage and foster international social contacts between individual Senators and Senate Groups.
- C. To constitute a resource for the current membership in the areas of training and development.

BY-LAW 21-7. CHAIRMAN:

The immediate Past President of the organization shall be chairman of the Senate, he shall chair the Senator's Forum for meeting at bi-monthly intervals, and he shall, subject to budgetary limitations, be responsible for the preparation and distribution to Senators of information on matters pertaining to the Senate.

SECTION 3. STRUCTURE:

The organization of the Senate shall not be too formal or highly structured and the number of officers shall be the minimum necessary to perform basic administrative functions. Subject to the provisions of this section the establishment of a structure for the Senate shall be subject to the advice of the General Assembly.

Section 4. LIMITATIONS: The Senate shall not engage in any activity which would be likely to conflict with the purpose or activities of Junior Chamber International or any LOH or LOHs. It shall not make public announcements or media releases, which conform to all constitutional provisions and policies of Junior Chamber International which relate to Senators individually or as a group.

Section 5. FAILURE TO COMPLY: Should any international or national Senate (other than the Junior Chamber International Senate) fail to comply with the provisions of this by-law, the members of such group may have their Senatorships revoked under the provisions of By-Law 21-1, unless otherwise

CHAPTER XXI
SENATORS

POLICY 21-1. SENATORSHIPS

Section 1. PROSPECTIVE SENATORS: A Senatorship is awarded to honor citizens and past individual members who have rendered outstanding service to Junior Chamber in this context, the awarding of a Senatorship shall be available not only to former past officers, but also to outstanding members who, because of personal circumstances beyond their control, were unable to serve as officers of their local or MOH.

Section 2. STATUS OF SENATORS: The organization encourages each LOH and MOH to include a self-operative provision in its constitution that, upon the availability of Senatorship to any member, past or current, said member shall also be eligible to payment of LOH and MOH dues as a matter wholly for local and/or national jurisdiction.

Section 3. PRESENTATION OF SENATORSHIPS: The organization urges each LOH and MOH to conduct the presentation of Senatorships with appropriate dignity, propriety, and a formal presentation ceremony.

Section 4. SENATE GROUPS: MOHs shall include in their constitutions a provision indicating that Senate groups are subject to the by-laws, policies and regulations of the MOH.

Section 5. SENATE GROUP REPORTING: International and national Senate Groups shall submit to the Senate Chairman of the organization at Cunneco a report of their activities for the year. Each report shall be accompanied by details of the international members and such additional details as may be deemed appropriate by the Executive Committee.

- A. Name and mailing address.
- B. A statement of its purposes.
- C. Names and addresses of its officers.

D. Description of its current activities and future plans, including the description of activities for the current year, including the following:

- i. Description of State Senate Groups, when applicable.
- ii. Schedule of meetings for the coming year.
- iii. Description of planned activities for the coming year.

Failure of any Senate Group to submit such annual report and plans, or any other failure to comply with the provisions of By-Law 21-6, shall be interpreted as failure to comply, under the provisions of By-Law 21-1, unless it violates the Constitution of JCI, or impinge on the freedom of any LOH, LOHs, or MOHs.

Application for Elective Office

POLICY 27-11 - JCI Third World National President shall be appointed by the International processing committee and shall be elected by the National Committee and shall be appointed by the International Committee.

An award known as "Junior Chamber International (JCI) Senatorship" granting membership in Junior Chamber International and in the Junior Chamber International Senate may be awarded to individual members or past members as a means of honoring them for rendering outstanding service to Junior Chamber. The awarding of such status shall not exempt the member from paying regular dues to the state, national or international organizations.

Approval of the application shall only be granted by the president of the Local Organization Member, the president of the State Organization Member, the president of the National Organization Member and the president of the International organization, and no other approval shall be required or permitted.

All applications submitted must be on the application form approved and distributed by Junior Chamber International.

Fee:

The application shall be accompanied with two checks one made payable to Junior Chamber International for the amount established by JCI and a second check made payable to The U.S. Jaycees for twenty-five dollars \$25.00, which is to be used for World Congress and Area Conference promotional activities. No other fees shall be required or permitted to be assessed.

Criteria:
Seniorships for current or past individual members shall be restricted to members of at least five (5) years standing for services rendered at any level of this organization. There shall be no other criteria imposed by any group other than the Local Organization Member.
